TRAFFIC CALMING COMING TO WINCHESTER ROAD

Local resident, Karen Murray talks about how important these measures are to her

“Residents in Winchester Road had raised concerns about speeding in the past, but it was the advice and support we had from Cllr Rackham and her colleagues that helped us secure these much needed measures.

“She got the Council’s Traffic Engineers on the case and together we worked up the proposals which have now been backed by 98% of people who responded to the consultation. Sheree and her colleagues came round to make sure we all knew about the consultation and it is great that the scheme will now be going ahead.

“I have no doubt it will make the road much safer.”

Extra Parking in Armstrong Avenue

Following the building of three new houses in Armstrong Avenue, none of which were designed with any parking, local Conservatives have now persuaded the Council to create up to 12 additional parking spaces by allowing pavement parking.

Commenting on the decision, Cllr Sheree Rackham said,

“It’s great that the Council has seen sense and come up with this proposal.

“Allowing three, new, family houses to be built without parking was ridiculous when you see how much pressure there is on parking in the street already. Hopefully this will help residents in Armstrong Avenue and Conyers Close to have a better chance of finding somewhere to park near their homes.

“This should also improve access for refuse vehicles, helping to prevent missed collections, something residents have been complaining about for some time.”

Safer Crossing for disabled factory workers

Sheree Rackham, Paul Braham and Iain Duncan Smith have managed to overturn Labour Cabinet Member, Clyde Loakes’ refusal to install a pedestrian crossing in Jubilee Avenue, called for by blind and other disabled people working at the Clarity factory on the Highams Park industrial estate.

The Council’s engineers will now be working up the details of where the crossing will go and it is hoped that it will be in place before the end of the year.

General Election Result

Iain Duncan Smith
Comfortably
Re-elected by Hale End & Highams Park Voters

The General Election on 7 May saw the Conservative Party win an overall majority and Iain Duncan Smith re-elected with just short of 50% of the votes cast in the Chingford & Woodford Green constituency.

The Conservative Party won 331 seats across the Country, Labour 232, Lib-Dems 8, SNP 56. The Greens and UKIP each won just one seat.

Iain has also been re-appointed to the post of Secretary of State for Work & Pensions with the remit to continue with the reforms to the welfare system which have seen over 2m more people finding work since 2010.



Speaking after the result was announced, Iain said, ***"This is a fantastic result for the Country."***
